Rights and Equalities

Stop being a member of the European Court of Human Rights.

Change the UK's current Human Rights Act and make a new UK Bill of Rights.

Protect the rights of the disabled.

UKIP will make a Government Department called the Department for Health and Care, and create a long term funded social care system and bring it into the NHS.

Disability

UKIP will not cut disability benefits.

UKIP will make sure those with on-going health care needs choose where they wish to live, unless they are unable to make that choice themselves, or care at home becomes unviable.

Reform Work Capability Assessments by speaking to disabled people and disability charities.

Health and Care

Will cut waiting times for mental health doctor referrals to a maximum of 28 days.

Create a mental health fund in NHS.

Homes

Launch a review into housing association operations which manage 60 per cent of the socially rented sector and have received £23 billion of Government funding in the past 14 years.

Build up to 100,000 extra affordable houses each year.

Get rid of the bedroom tax.

Wales

Enforce the minimum and living wage and reverse government cuts to the number of minimum wage inspectors in England and Wales.

Have a bank holiday for St David's Day in Wales on 1st March.


Jobs

Be tougher on zero hours contracts and limit their use.

Make employers advertise jobs to British people before anyone else.

Protect workers' rights once we have left the EU.
